



Emotional Abuse: The child has suffered or was at	Terrorizing or threat of violence: A climate of fear, placing the child in unpredictable or chaotic circumstances, bullying or frightening a child, threats of violence against the child or child's loved ones or objects. Verbal abuse or belittling: Non-physical forms of overtly
substantial risk of suffering from mental, emotional, or	hostile or rejecting treatment. Shaming or ridiculing the child, or belittling and degrading the child.
developmental problems caused by overtly hostile, punitive treatment, or habitual or extreme verbal abuse (threatening, belittling, etc.).	Isolation/confinement: Adult cuts the child off from normal social experiences, prevents friendships or makes the child believe that he or she is alone in the world. Includes locking a child in a room, or isolating the child from the normal household routines.
	Exploiting or corrupting behaviour: The adult permits or encourages the child to engage in destructive, criminal, antisocial, or deviant behaviour.
