a) PhD in Family Medicine and Primary Care

CGPS.15.07PhD_FamMedRev

Professor Gillian Bartlettsquilant Associate Professor and Graduate Program Director for the Department of Family Medicinperesented the PhD in Family Medicine Primary Care

This program was presented at the last CGPS meeting. In light of the concerns raised at the last meeting about the lack of program requirements, Professor Bartlett preservised proposaThe revisions include2 credits of coursespecifically innowledge translation (3 credite)rticipatory research (3 credite)ree1-credit adanced doctoral seminated 3 credits of an elective course. Students coming out of the Master's will take 6 credits at the minimum. There are currently 20 students enrolled in the Ad Hoc PhD program. Professor Bartletts enrollmento increase.

There was a question about the advanced research methods course that is listed as an elective. Cindy Smith Secretary to Subcommittee on Courses and Teaching (SOTTR) ed that this is the right approach because students have a choice of reset motion ourse and will be able to take a course outside the department, so a single course code bearins ded under the required courses.

Another Quncil member asked a question about the projected increase in enrollment and whether there were any space or resource constraints on this growth.

b) PhD in Epidemiology – Global Health

Professor Madhukar Pai, Canada Research Chair in Translational Epidemiology and Global Health, Department of Epidemiology, Biostatistics and Occupational Health and the PhD in Epidemiology – Global Health option.
